DID YOU KNOW?

- Farming, fishing and forestry are the nation's most dangerous industry with 23.2 deaths per 100,000 adult workers in 2016.¹
- In 2015, 401 farmers and farm workers died from a work-related injury.²
- There were 491 crashes from 2010 to 2015 involving farm equipment on Illinois Roads, resulting in 34 deaths and 620 injuries.³
- Nationwide, about every three days, a child dies in an agricultural-related incident.
- Nationwide, over half of all tractor related accidental deaths occur from tractor overturns.
- The annual cost of occupational injuries in agriculture is \$8.3 billion in medical costs and lost productivity.⁴
