## **WHAT TO TELL DISPATCHER**

1. The exact location of the scene
2. The telephone number from which the call is made and your name
3. The nature of accident (electrocution, entrapment, laceration, etc.)
4. The number of victim(s)
5. The condition of victim(s) (bleeding, heart attack, amputation, etc.)
6. The type of aid that has been given to victims (CPR, bandaging, etc.)
7. Whether someone will meet EMS at the entrance to a remote location
8. Any special conditions that may hinder rescue (mud, fallen trees)
9. Other information as necessary

Do not hang up the phone until the dispatcher tells you to do so.
